

Knock on wood:

A phrase said to cancel out (imaginary) bad luck.

Know something inside-out (v.):

To know something completely and thoroughly. *Ex: "Let me show you around - I know this neighborhood inside-out."*

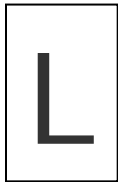
Know something like the back of (one's) hand (v.):

Same as "to know something inside-out" (above). *Ex: "I know this city like the back of my hand."*

Know the score (v.):

To know the facts. To know how things go.

Know-it-all (n.): Slightly derogatory (=insulting) term to describe a person who thinks that he/she knows everything. *Ex: "Robert is so conceited! Yeah, he's a real know-it-all."*



Laid back (adj.): Relaxed, easy-going. *Ex: "I like Tom. He's really laid-back."*

(A) lady-killer:

A handsome man; a man who charms women. This does NOT mean "killer of ladies!" :)

Lame (adj.):

Inadequate; Bad. *Ex: "That's the lamest excuse I've ever heard."*

Last but not least:

Last in order but not last in importance. *Ex: "Last but not least I'd like to thank my parents."*

Last ditch (adj.):

Final (*has a slight connotation of "desperate"*). *Ex: "They made a last-ditch effort to win the game, but came up short."*

Later:

Short for "See you later."
