

Poker face (n.)

A face with no expression. Also common is "to be poker-faced."

"I couldn't tell if she was joking. She's got a great poker face."

Pop the question (v.)

To propose marriage.

"He finally popped the question after dating for five years."

Power through (v.)

To continue despite difficulty, exhaustion, or obstacles.

"I was exhausted, but I powered through the last hour of the presentation."

Preachy (adj.)

(More common in written criticism than casual conversation.) An adjective that describes someone (or something) that tries to preach how one should live, etc.

"A preachy movie"

Pressed for time

In a hurry.

"I'd love to stay and chat, but I'm a little pressed for time."

Promise someone the moon (v.)

To promise someone lots of extravagant things (unrealistically).

"He promised her the moon, but couldn't deliver on any of his promises."

Psyched (adj.)

Excited.

"I'm so psyched about the concert tomorrow!"

Psycho (n.)

Crazy, mentally-unbalanced person.

"You should stay away from him. He's a bit of a psycho."

Puke (v.)

To vomit. To throw up.

"He ate too much at the buffet and ended up puking in the parking lot."

Pull a fast one (v.)

To cheat or to deceive.

"Con men are experts at pulling a fast one on unsuspecting passers by."
